Editorial - We need professional missionaries

CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR PROFESSIONAL LATIN MISSIONARIES

In light of the five centuries of Christian missionary activity in Latin America, a valid question is, how will the Latin missionaries be trained in this new century? What changes in preparation and in training methodology will be necessary for the **professional missionaries**?

CONTEXT:

1. Persistent dichotomy in the theological mindset of Latin America: between the spiritual and the material. With the spiritual = the Bible, and the material = secular profession
2. Missiological dichotomy, where missions are conceived as being the activity of establishing churches, but there is an absence of a practical understanding of holistic missions.
3. Charismatic Pentecostalism that affirms the perspective that the Spirit edifies and the letter (studies) kills. So, the power of the Spirit edifies, and ones calling matters vs. educational pursuits.
4. In Latin America becoming a professional is a luxury and something that parents aspire that their children attain. Because of this, the Christian professional has a strong sense that it is their loyal duty to work in their profession in order to repay their parents, and becoming involved in missions carries with it a sense of financial embezzlement and of family disloyalty.
5. The Latin mentality regarding education tends to be that one studies in order to get a degree, and not as a foundation for building life-long skills, or in building permanence to self-driven academic learning for use in practical service.
6. The professional missionary will tend to want to listen to, or consider as their mentor, only other professionals, and will tend to look down on, or sub-estimate the teachings of a pastor or\ of a traditional non-professional missionary.
7. If we have a holistic view of missions that is aligned with what we see in the kingdom of God, then we need professional missionaries that can attend to different types of needs in order to become agents of redemption within the whole of creation. So, then we need people who carry with them the vision to reach out with the whole gospel that we see Jesus reached out with, one that does not just attend to spiritual needs.

Premature departure - Resources needed

- I debriefed a family last week who have not long returned from the field. It was their first term and they had intended staying considerably longer. Their own cultural and language learning was going extremely well and their ministry was beginning to take off, but their children, had major cultural shock so they had to return quite unexpectedly which has been a source of extreme disappointment. One of the children is still quite traumatised and emotionally fragile. I have worked through re-entry stuff with them but I don't have anything that addresses the problem of premature departure from the field, and am wondering if any of you have something appropriate that I could pass on to them? Wow! Even though I;m not married with kids, my story is so similar in that I had to return prematurely, after thinking God had called me to that field long term and after being seemingly very succesful.

Many times I have asked the question: "why did I feel God's 'call' and then it 'all went wrong'?"

Spiritual mentoring has definitely been key to me, lots of counseling, care and finding meaning to my loss.

I am praying that the Lord will bring people around them to love them and show them that they are not a failure.

Also meditating in God's truth about their identity in Christ would help, although, as you say, it may take time.

But my concern for this couple is that they were not seeing their children's needs for a healthy transition. What about the book Pollock, D. C., & Van Reken, R. E. (2009). Third culture kids: Growing up among worlds (rev. ed.). Boston, MA: Nicholas Brealey Publishing.

What about looking more into what the family dynamics are and how they can become a healthier family? The kids probably need a lot of love and reassurance from their parents.
