Editorial: The Global Member Care Network met in Germany



The Global Member Care Network met three times during the recent consultation. The first was a closed session where the board which was inaugurated during the Thailand consultation met to review progress and work on the forthcoming Global Member Care consultation. This will take April 23-27, 2012, in Chiangmai, Thailand. with the theme: "Global Voices on Global Challenges." "The heart of the conference is to create a platform to hear global voices about member care in a borderless world, which is characterized by increasing hostilities and schisms.

A further two open meetings were held on consecutive afternoons and it was great to be joined by the committed, the challenged and the curious in the area of Member Care. We were particularly encouraged to have pastors and leaders from sending churches join us as this is an area we want to grow in hearing from, helping and networking with.

A number of topics went into our melting pot (which never reached boiling point thankfully!) – starting a member care programme from scratch, are for the persecuted, various aspects of dealing with a crisis -from preparation to crisis debriefing. Sadly the last twelve months have given us plenty of opportunity to hone our skills in this area and to encourage those living under hostile conditions.

GMCN co-ordinator, Harry Hoffmann, declared:” It became clear that the GMCN has helped Japan, Australia, New Zealand and Brazil to develop a member care network, with Korea, Philippines, different African regions and Spanish speaking South America slowly developing member care as well. In the last 2 days we had an amazing time in particular in regards to Brazil member care movement.” Two books on member care have been written in Portuguese by Brazilian missionaries, one a collection of articles by missionary mums on TCKs and the other on general aspects of Member Care.

All in all, we feel very encouraged by our time together , the strength of our global networking and the very real sense of a movement which has been re-energised by God’s Spirit and a commitment to partnership in the gospel across latitudes.

Culture & Transformation by Sherwood Lingenfelter

Transformation is a familiar buzzword among God's people. We want to be transformed ourselves and play a role in the transformation of other individuals and the world at large. This desire to be involved in God's transforming work is often based on good intentions but bad assumptions about other cultures, how we should interact with them, and what we should change about them. As the world shrinks and connections between individuals and cultures become more numerous and complex, understanding our own cultural assumptions as well as those of others becomes increasingly important for Christians to be transformational agents in the world. This course's aim is to heighten our sensitivity to our own cultural assumptions and biases, and to recognize the blind spots those create as we interact with others. Ministry ought to be incarnational. In order to minister incarnationally, we need to first become aware of our own cultural biases and how to transform them, so that we can more humbly and sensitively approach others and their cultural biases. Exegeting a culture is the central activity of this course. It describes the work of unpacking one's cultural biases and assumptions as well as the systems and structures within a culture. It is something we may have done intuitively but without awareness of how our own biases are affecting the process. Our hope is that this course will give you a new awareness of and fresh perspective on how to exegete a culture from God's perspective. Using case studies, historical examples, and your own ministry experience, we will learn how globalization, economics, and other social forces have shaped a culture and how those forces create both opportunities and challenges for transformational ministry. With this knowledge, you should be able to more effectively engage in partnership with majority world Christians for ministry that transforms you, other people, and communities. <http://itunes.apple.com/itunes-u/mb500-culture-transformation/id427248423>

Praise be to God. The ministry of MUT has steadily grown in the last 18 years to fulfill God given objectives of meeting some of the common unmet needs of missionaries and other Christian workers involved in direct and indirect evangelism. There are – 140 organizations & Institutions with over 16000 workers have taken membership in MUT as on 1st Sept 2011. They are spread all over the country doing different ministries among various people groups. MUT has two wings now 1) IMPACT for workers registered under Missions 2) SMILE (Scheme For Missions linked to Evangelism) for missionaries and the other for workers of Bibles Colleges, Mission Hospitals, Mission schools, Networks and associations of evangelists.

The ministry is run mostly by volunteers with clear cut objectives and focused activities. There are seven different programs in MUT to take care of God's messengers in physical, Emotional and Spiritual areas to make them effective witness and to build God's Kingdom in India. 1) Assistance to the families of missionaries who die while in service, 2) Assistance towards major illness & accidents to missionary and family members, 3) Crisis Relief, 4) M Kids welfare, 5) Retired Missionaries welfare, 6) Providing places for rest and rejuvenation and 7) Personal Development programs.
